



Clinical Caseworker

The Clinical Caseworker is responsible for the supervision of young people and designated responsibilities assigned on shift. This person must demonstrate maturity, patience and appropriate staff modeling which adhere to the code of ethics and best practices in the field.

The Clinical Caseworker participates in the development of resident treatment plans, facilitates group processes and maintains clinical files. The Clinical Caseworker also applies education techniques of the therapeutic community in daily life, organizing, coordinating and leading activities including group facilitations to ensure learning and the acquisition of attitudes and appropriate behavior in order to rehabilitate successfully within society

As Clinical Caseworker you will:

- Ensure that the quality of care provided is appropriate and consistent with the policies and procedures within the organization;
- Development and documentation of resident's treatment plan utilizing a multi-disciplinary team and the tools of therapy;
- Facilitate assigned groups and meetings;
- Participation in all community meetings;
- Participation in case conferencing;
- Learn and role model the 21 competencies of the Portage Program;
- Oversee daily routines of program participants and facilitate therapeutic programming;
- Accurate completion of log books, incident/behavioral reports as necessary and all applicable shift paperwork;
- Provide council and support to program residents;
- Behavioral intervention as necessary;
- Learn, adhere and remain up to date on all policies and procedures of the organization;
- Perform other related duties.

Schedule:

Full time: 37,5 hours/week (days and evenings – Weekdays and weekends)

Part-time: 30 hours or less / week (days and evenings – Weekdays and weekends)

On Call : Variable hours (days and evenings – Weekdays and weekends)

Salary: according to the salary program
